This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

1. What is this product?

Objectives

The product is designed to provide a return in the form of (1) conditional interest payments and (2) a cash payment on termination of the product. The timing and amount of these payments will depend on the performance of the **underlying**. The product has a fixed term and will terminate on the **maturity date**, unless terminated early. If, at maturity, the **final reference level** of the **underlying** has fallen below the **barrier level**, the product may return less than the **product notional amount** or even zero.

Early termination following an autocall: The product will terminate prior to the **maturity date** if, on any **autocall observation date**, the **reference level** is at or above the **autocall barrier level**. On any such early termination, you will on the immediately following **autocall payment date** receive, in addition to any final interest payment, a cash payment equal to the autocall payment of EUR 1,000. No interest payments will be made on any date after such **autocall payment date**. The relevant dates are shown in the table(s) below.

Interest: If the product has not terminated early, on each **interest payment date** you will receive an interest payment of EUR 50 together with any previously unpaid interest payments if the **reference level** is at or above the **interest barrier level** on the immediately preceding **interest observation date**. If this condition is not met, you will receive no interest payment on such **interest payment date**. The relevant dates are shown in the table(s) below.

Termination on the maturity date: If the product has not terminated early, on the **maturity date** you will receive:

- if the **final reference level** is at or above the **barrier level**, a cash payment equal to EUR 1,000; or
- if the **final reference level** is below the **barrier level**, a cash payment directly linked to the performance of the **underlying**. The cash payment will equal (i) the **product notional amount** multiplied by (ii) (A) the **final reference level** divided by (B) the **strike level**.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlying**, the product and the product issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

When purchasing this product during its lifetime, the purchase price may include accrued interest on a pro rata basis.

 2. they seek income, expect the movement in the underlying to perform in a way that generates a favourable return, have an investment horizon of the recommended holding period specified below and understand that the product may terminate early;
 3. they accept the risk that the issuer could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product and they are able to bear a total loss of their investment; and
 4. they are willing to accept a level of risk to achieve potential returns that is consistent with the summary risk indicator shown below.

2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 10 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to cash in early. You may have to pay significant extra costs to cash in early.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance of the **underlying** at a medium level and the potential for us to be unable to pay you any amounts due as very unlikely.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment.

If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

This table shows the money you could get back over the next 10 years under different scenarios, assuming that you invest EUR 10,000.

The scenarios shown illustrate how your investment could perform. You can compare them with the scenarios of other products. The scenarios presented are an estimate of future performance based on evidence from the past on how the value of this investment varies, and are not an exact indicator. What you get will vary depending on how the market performs and how long you keep the product. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances, and it does not take into account the situation where we are not able to pay you. 3. What happens if the manufacturer is unable to pay out?

You are exposed to the risk that the issuer might be unable to meet its obligations in connection with the product for instance in the event of bankruptcy or an official directive for resolution action. The product is not a deposit and as such is not covered by any deposit protection scheme.

4. What are the costs?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs.

The amounts shown here are the cumulative costs of the product itself, for three different holding periods. They include potential early exit penalties. The figures assume you invest EUR 10,000. The figures are estimates and may change in the future.

The costs shown in the table above represent how much the expected costs of the product would affect your return, assuming the product performs in line with the moderate performance scenario. Disregarding the impact on your return in that scenario, the estimated entry and exit costs as a percentage of the **product notional amount** are estimated to be 10.25% if you cash in after 1 year, 10.25% if you cash in after 5 years and 9.75% if you cash in at the end of the recommended holding period.

The costs shown in the table above represent the split of the reduction in yield shown in the costs over time table at the end of the recommended holding period. The split of the actual estimated costs of the product as a percentage of the **product notional amount** is estimated to be as follows: entry costs: 9.75% and exit costs: 0%.

5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 10 years

The product aims to provide you with the return described under "1. What is this product?" above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until 10 March 2032 (maturity).

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product either (1) through the exchange (if the product is exchange traded) or (2) off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. No fees or penalties will be charged by the issuer for any such transaction, however an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable. By selling the product before its maturity, you may receive back less than you would have received if you had kept the product until maturity.
